# A Man Worthy of our Praise and Hope

The men traveling with Jesus on a stormy Galilean night said something that ought to make us sit up and take notice: "What kind of a man is this ...?" If we ask ourselves that same question, we will start to see the big picture of who Jesus Christ is instead of concentrating on the facets of His personality revealed by individual stories.

Imagine the wind—which had been funneled through a narrow gorge—pushing out over the Sea of Galilee, making the water turbulent. Jesus and His disciples were caught in just such a dangerous storm while making their way to Gadara. As waves crashed over the deck of the boat, the experienced seamen onboard were convinced that death was imminent.

But Jesus was sleeping. He was resting quietly during a storm so frightening that the Greek word used to describe it is *seismos*—from the same root that gives us the phrase "seismic activity" for earthquakes. What kind of man is this who can sleep while the boat heaves and pitches? The answer is that as the One who *created* the seas, Jesus knows how a storm brews and what energy causes a wave to stay in motion. That's the kind of man He is: a divine Being

cloaked in humanity, who rebuked the winds and sea so they became perfectly calm.

Scripture indicates that both the air and the water were instantly stilled. Such is the power of Jesus, the Creator and Lord over the universe. Taken together, all the Bible stories about Jesus reveal the "big picture" that He is the only man worthy of glory, honor and praise (Revelation 5:12).


Christ's resurrection is the foundation of our faith. There are many people who think it's sufficient to believe that Jesus lived and died. However, the Savior's restoration to life is central to what He claimed about His identity and to Christianity as a faith. Picking up on the previous questions, we must ask what kind of man is this who rose from the dead?

The answer is that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, who died for our sins and rose again because death has no power over Him. The resurrection validated Jesus' ministry. All along, He said and did things to reveal Himself as Lord. When the Lamb of God—the perfect sacrifice for sin—conquered death, He confirmed His identity. Who but the Creator could return to life?

We could also answer the question by saying that the kind of man who returns from the dead is one worthy of our hope. Since Jesus Christ affirmed God's power to give His followers eternal life, their earthly existence is not marching toward an end; rather, it is the opening chapter of a beautiful and never-ending relationship with God. Paul said that at death, Christians are absent from their bodies and

present with the Lord (2 Corinthians 5:8). So, the best is yet to come!

Apart from Jesus' resurrection, there is no hope. Those who chase after their own versions of immortality have no assurance of life after death, because of them, there is none. Yet believers face death with the confidence that nothing can separate them from the love of the Father. Death is just a short trip home.

Prayerfully consider this golden opportunity to serve and then contact Bruce Hultine (cahultine@icloud.com) for your questions and details about the program.


We also can prepare taxes for all members of Abiding Savior, regardless of income. If you would like more information contact Bruce at the email listed above.

The Women's Fellowship craft in February went very well. We even had a teacher from Abiding Savior School who had her 4th grade student's make them for Valentine's Day.



March 19-22, we will welcome our National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA) Team to our school. NLSA encourages and recognizes schools that provide quality Christian education and engage in continuous improvement. The purpose of NLSA is to help all Lutheran schools improve; help all Lutheran schools evaluate themselves based on their unique purposes; assure a level of quality for accredited Lutheran schools based on national standards; and give appropriate recognition to those schools that complete the process successfully.

As part of the process, we have already begun to identify our continuous improvement plan. Some of the things that we are planning include the following:

- Additional roman shades for the front playground.
- Outdoor sinks on front and back playground.
- Watering system for outdoor back planters.
- Storage area for blue blocks.
- Bench planters for the front playground, including a prayer/ meditation area.
- Streamlining our registration, billing, communication, lesson planning, and assessment system.
- Be prepared to add infants and toddlers if Universal Pre-K adversely affects our older population.
- Continue to look for and prepare future staff. Use our connections with current congregation members and school parents to encourage getting units. (We currently have three parents who are getting early childhood units to be ready next year.)
- Work with CUI on reimplementing their early childhood program

If you are a Grandparent of a preschool-age child, we cordially invite you to attend our Grandparents Day event on March 11. We will begin in the church praising God with music, enjoy a snack, photo opportunity, and craft in the gym, and end with an open house in the preschool.
