What is Lost and Left

Is it possible for grieving to be an act of worship? In Nehemiah 1:3-11, we learn about Nehemiah, an Israelite who served as cupbearer to the king of Babylon. The cupbearer's job was to taste any wine brought to the king; in case it was poisoned. The king had to trust his cupbearer with his very life. Nehemiah sat down and wept for days when he learned Jerusalem's walls had been destroyed, leaving his people defenseless. Yet his tears weren't just a simple outpouring of strong emotion. Through weeping, fasting, and prayer, Nehemiah allowed his distress to lead him into deeper communion with God.

Shedding tears over what was lost, giving full expression to his pain, was an essential component of Nehemiah's prayerful turning toward God. His bold display of sorrow was an affirmation of his belief that God alone was capable of restoring Jerusalem and her people to their former glory. As he prayed, Nehemiah reminded God of His promise to gather the exiles and dwell permanently among His people (Nehemiah 1:8-9).

As Christians, we can sometimes interpret another person's outward display of grief as a lack of faith. *Why are they crying*, we many wonder, *if they truly trust* *God?* But Nehemiah's example shows us that taking time to lament what we have lost can be an act of worship. When we are in pain, God invites us to cling to His promises and offer our tears to Him as devotion, even if they are all we have to give.

Navigating loss is a complex process; there is no straightforward path through grief. Yet Nehemiah's journey from lamenting the broken walls of Jerusalem to rebuilding them offers us insight as we partner with God to put life's shattered places back together.

After grieving the destruction of Jerusalem's fortifications, Nehemiah asked King Artaxerxes I of Persia for permission to return to that city and rebuild its protective wall. Taking stock of what remains after loss is an important step as we move from grieving to rebuilding. It can be difficult to find glimmers of hope while surveying the ruins of broken lives, dreams, or relationships, but we are never without the one thing that matters most, God's presence. Nehemiah knew this to be true. which is why he toured Jerusalem to inspect its walls and learn what was needed to repair the damage. In doing so, he oriented himself towards hope, that is, he looked for what could be accomplished with God's help.

As the Lord did with Nehemiah, He also invites us to view rubble in our life with eyes of faith. So, let's dare to look beyond our present circumstances toward the joy of future restoration.

She asked if their staff members could visit her, so they went to her house and brought other Christian materials. They noticed a positive change in Christina's outlook on life since she began reading the Gospel message. Christina continues to stay connected with LHM - Paraguay staff and is enjoying learning more about Jesus.

A MAN SPOKE, A WORLD LISTENED



Speaking of his father, Dr. Walter A. Maier, in the book A Man Spoke, A World Listened. by his son Dr. Paul L. Maier. we read on page

72 of the necessity of a link between religion and radio and how The Walther League appropriated \$7,000 for the project, and this sum was matched by Lutheran laymen, friends, and even seminary students. Thus a500- watt transmitter was purchased and soon two tall masts connected by antennae projected above the roof of Concordia Seminary. The Federal Radio Commission assigned a 545.1meter wave length and the call letters KFUO to the attic station. Dr. Maier interpreted these as "Keep Forward Upward Onward" and dubbed the station motto. "The Gospel Voice." On Sunday, December 14, 1924, KFUO began broadcasting at 9:15 p.m. with the words: "This is Station KFUO, Concordia Theological Seminary...." It was an exciting moment.

In the history of Radio Station KFUO (located at https:// www.kfuo.org/history), we note: The removal of Concordia Seminary from its location on Jefferson Avenue in South St. Louis to the new campus property in suburban Clayton in 1926 also brought about the relocation of KFUO to Clayton. But not before the problem of housing the radio facility had been solved by approaching the Lutheran Laymen's League which, by resolution, offered to re-build and provide annual maintenance for KFUO at the new Seminary site. The explicit understanding was the \$50,000 would be required for the

new station and new equipment, and an annual sum of \$20,000 to \$25,000 for operations. An additional resolution by the Lutheran Laymen's League submitted to the Synod, assembled in St. Louis, on Wednesday, June 15, 1926, was as follows: "Resolved: That Synod take over the station and gratefully accept the proposition of the Lutheran Laymen's League to supply all necessary funds for its removal to the new Seminary, and its maintenance in the future, and that the control of the Station be placed in the hands of the Board of Control of Concordia Seminary."
