Take a Moment and Pause

How do you respond when someone mistreats you? Are you quick to judge that person, cataloging all the reasons you didn't deserve to be treated so unfairly? That was David's initial response when the fair treatment he expected was denied.

David, while still on the run from Saul, sent men from his army to request provisions from Nabal, a rich man in the area. David felt sure Nabal would look favorably on him and meet the needs of his army. Not only would that have been customary, but David had also earned the favor by protecting Nabal's flocks. Yet the request, though reasonable, was scornfully rejected.

When we feel spurned, mistreated, or unappreciated, it can cause us to respond in a way that only makes the situation worse. In David's case, his anger flared, and he set out for revenge. But before he and his 400 warriors could make it to their destination, Nabal's wife Abigail intercepted them, falling on her face to apologize for her husband's behavior and to reason with David. In that moment, David had a choice to make. He could either charge right past her, fueled by his own rage and need for justice, or he could pause (James 1:19). God gave him the wisdom to make the better choice. The next time anger erupts in your heart, will you follow David's example and stop to listen to wisdom?

When David saw Abigail kneeling in the road, he could have ordered her out of his path. After all, he was powerful. He had been anointed to be the King of Israel and had an entire army behind him. Nothing obligated him to stop and hear what Abigail had to say; but thankfully, he did.

Have you ever been barreling toward a huge mistake, only to hear someone caution you? Did you consider what the person was saying? And would you say things turned out better as a result? Or perhaps the opposite has been the case and you ignored wise advice; if so, it's highly likely you learned a great deal from that experience!

Abigail's words were wise and persuasive, and David prudently chose to listen with humility. His decision to heed the woman's pleas diverted him from a course that would have tainted his future rule.

If you're facing a decision today, God doesn't expect you to figure it out on your own. Maybe the Holy Spirit is providing counsel (John 14:26), or it might be that God has sent someone to advise you. Who is the Abigail in your path? May you have the wisdom to listen to those God has placed in front of you.

Surprising Places to Find God this Summer Laura Kelly Fanucci



School is done and summer has begun. But between registering kids for sports and mapping family road trips, I've had to catch myself. Where could we seek and find God in this new season, too?

Here are places you might delight to encounter God with your family this summer.

By the Water

If you spend time near a lake, river or ocean, let your thoughts

wander from the waves to the God who once walked on them.

Take a moment to pray to Jesus who lived near the shore: "Once again he went out along the sea. All the crowd came to him and he taught them" (Mark 2:13).

Eating Outside

When we think of Jesus eating, we often picture the Last Supper in the upper room. But remember, he ate outside too: miraculous meals when he fed thousands or ordinary afternoons when he stopped to eat with his friends. Sound familiar for the rest stops and road trips of your youth?

Christ even cooked for his friends the morning after his resurrection, a reminder that every picnic or campfire meal can lead us to prayer: "Jesus said to them, 'Come, have breakfast'" (John 21:12).

Under the Night Sky As a child, I listened to my grandfather tell ancient tales of the constellations around a bonfire. Our faith is full of star stories, too: the creation of the heavens in Genesis, God's promise to Abraham of countless descendants and the new star that pointed the Magi to Bethlehem.

How could campfire conversations invite your children or grandchildren to wonder like the sky-gazing psalmist, "When I see your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you set in place" (Psalm 8:3)?

Among the Flowers

As a mom of five boys, I have been given dandelion bouquets for years now. Each proud fistful reminds me to stop and see the beauty — even in the weeds — that God has planted around us.

Summer brings full bloom to many landscapes, offering the sight and scent of creation's bounty in ways that inspire our prayer and praise: "Learn from the way the wild flowers grow. They do not work or spin. But I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was clothed like one of them" (Matthew 6:28-29).

On Vacation

Jesus and his followers were often on the move during his ministry. While their travels were far from a summer vacation, any chance we get to see or stay somewhere different can open our eyes to new ways of knowing God.

As you pack for a family reunion or weekend with friends, carry the spirit of the disciples on the road to Emmaus: "Then they said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning (within us) while he spoke to us on the way and opened the Scriptures to us?"" (Luke 24:32).

Gathering Together

After long months of isolation or separation, many are rejoicing in reconnecting with loved ones.

As we set extra places at the table, spread picnic blankets at the park or double the recipes for favorite summer treats, we can offer prayers of thanksgiving: "For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Matthew 18:20).

<u>In Rest</u>

Remember as you work and play this summer that rest is holy, too: "God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work he had done in creation" (Genesis 2:3).

Let yourself take a nap, read a spiritual book or curl up for a cuddle with your youngest family member. What space can you make for the Sabbath in each week of this fleeting season we call summer?

Impacting People Through Digital Engagement By Chad Fix



The world today is increasingly shaped and connected by the internet. As people become more present online, God's people are finding ways to share the Gospel in this space.

Journey Through Depression by Dr. Rick Marrs is LHM's latest **Project Connect** booklet. It deals with the causes of depression and how it impacts our physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being. Marrs also addresses recovery strategies, myths surrounding depression, and how caregivers can help. He reminds readers that "Whatever pain we are in, whatever is troubling us, Jesus invites us to believe, to know, that we are not alone."

The National Institute of Mental Health notes that depression impacts all ages and races/ ethnicities. In the U.S. alone, some 21 million adults experienced at least one major depressive episode (an event lasting two weeks or longer) in 2021. Globally, as of 2023, some 280 million people have depression, according to the World Health Organization.

Types of depression include Major Depression, Seasonal Affective Disorder, or related diagnoses like Bi-Polar Disorder. Depression triggers include physical causes, biological predisposition, trauma, grief or loss, aging, brain injury and, of course, relationship issues. Because of the complexities involved, consulting a professional is essential to finding out what's going on and how to treat it.

Recovering from depression is certainly possible. Proper care of the body (nutrition, exercise, rest, stress avoidance), medications, and alternative treatments all play a part. So does counseling. Still, finding the right counselor may take time. "If you feel like giving up, ask your pastor or another trusted Christian friend to check in with you on a regular basis and encourage you to keep trying until you find the right one for you," Marrs writes.

For caregivers—prayer, listening, and reminding the person that you love them are crucial. Marrs suggests joining them in a healthy pursuit like exercise, and just being there for them, but be sparing with advice as feelings can get in the way. If they mention thoughts of suicide, know and use the 988 suicide prevention hotline.

Depression can be awful, but it doesn't have the last word. "Even when we don't feel like Jesus is with us, we have His promise that He is (see Matthew 28:20)," Marrs writes. "His heart goes out to you, and He is deeply concerned about your welfare. God is here with you in your pain, whether it feels that way or not."
